

Bikes on Transperth services*

Cycling comes with added benefits. By riding to the station instead of driving you'll save on petrol and avoid the hassle of finding a parking spot. Cycling is also a great way to plan the day ahead or de-stress after a long day and is a convenient way to improve your overall wellbeing and fitness.

If you don't need your bike at the end of your journey, why take it with you? Transperth provides free bike shelters, lockers and u-rails for you to conveniently and safely park your bike at all train stations. A map showing all the bike facilities across the Transperth system is included in this brochure.

*Transperth defines 'bikes' as those that are powered by pedal power using pedals and a chain and are not supported by any motor. This excludes tricycles and tandems.

Bikes on trains

By following a few simple rules, travelling on Transperth trains with your bike is easy.

1. Bikes are not permitted on Transperth train services during peak periods.

During the morning peak, between 7.00am and 9.00am, Monday to Friday, bikes are not permitted on train services travelling towards Perth city.

In the afternoon peak, between 4.30pm and 6.30pm, Monday to Friday, bikes are not permitted on train services travelling away from Perth city.

2. Bikes cannot depart or pass through Perth, Perth Underground or Esplanade stations in any direction during the peak periods (as outlined above).

If you are on a train with your bike during peak periods, (travelling in the opposite direction to the restrictions outlined above), and are scheduled to arrive at Perth, Perth Underground or Esplanade stations, you will need to disembark at City West, Canning Bridge, Leederville or Mlver stations. Should you wish to continue your journey by train past the city stations, you will need to disembark and ride to the first station after the city of the line you wish to travel on.

3. Onboard etiquette

Your bike is your responsibility at all times. If a train carriage appears full, please try another one rather than force your way in. Do not block entrances with your bike or leave it unattended where it can fall or be knocked over. Priority areas are provided on trains for seniors, people in wheelchairs and parents with prams. You are permitted to use these areas, but should make them available for priority passengers.

Please note: A person with a bicycle can be asked to catch the next available train should a carriage be crowded or is anticipated to be crowded. A person who does not comply with an instruction given by an authorised person or Transit Officer can receive a penalty between \$200 and \$2,000.

Bikes on buses

Standard bicycles are not permitted on any Transperth bus service including train replacement buses.

Bikes on ferries

Transperth has allocated space for four bikes onboard Transperth ferries. Once these have been fully occupied, no other bicycles will be allowed onboard that particular service.

Passengers with bikes will be the last to be taken onboard. Bicycles must be stored only in the designated area and must not be stored alongside the seats.

Fold up bikes and chainless unicycles

Passengers with fold up bikes are permitted to travel on Transperth trains and buses at any time as long as the bicycle is contained within a carry bag exceeding no more than 86cm long x 68cm high x 36cm wide. Chainless unicycles are accepted on all Transperth services, space permitting. Both fold up bikes and unicycles must be kept out of the aisle and not take up a seat that another passenger may use.
